## The Qinshihuang Mausoleum and Its Terracotta Warriors

These terracotta warriors were buried in the year of 1, which				
boast a history of over 2,000 years. They belonged to one man, the <sup>2</sup>				
emperor of China, Qinshihuang.				
Qinshihuang had no sooner ascended the throne than began to build his mausoleum, which took				
nearly <sup>3</sup> years to complete. The mausoleum is 160 meters in height and				
kilometers in perimeter. Inside the tomb, various complicated				
palaces were built. It was beyond the imagination of modern people how great a project this was.				
The mausoleum is located near Xi'an. In 5, local farmers				
accidentally discovered some pottery figurines underground. The following archaeological				
excavations have found three vaults by now. Altogether over <sup>6</sup> pottery				
figurines, over 100 chariots, over 400 pottery horses and over 100 thousand weapons were				
unearthed.				
These pottery figurines are from <sup>7</sup> meters in height, and are				
divided into groups like general figurines and warrior figurines, etc. The bronze weapons like				
swords and lances unearthed from the vaults still have sharp blades although they had been buried				
underground for over <sup>8</sup> years.				
This is a grand underground military museum. We can				
imagine how powerful the Qin army was when it united China				
more than <sup>9</sup> years ago.				
In 10 , the Qin mausoleum				
and its warriors were listed on the World Heritage List.
